Welcome to our spring 2016 edition of The Gloucestershire Eye Therapy Trust Newsletter and our New Chairman!

Recently I had the honour of being invited to take up the position of chairman, and I was delighted to accept. My immediate past chairman was Charles Hartley, and before Charles was Anne Cadbury, both of whom gave much of their time to help, support and guide our charity. We are most grateful to them both and I am delighted that they will continue to serve on the Board of Trustees as I take on my new role. I would now like to introduce myself to you all and to supply a short summary of our activities during the past financial year.

I moved to Gloucestershire in 1986, to work as a community-based optometrist, and I was immediately impressed by the overall standard of eye care in this county. There were many reasons for this, one of which was the Gloucestershire Eye Therapy Trust (GETT) which was already playing a significant role in funding a variety of eye care improvements and innovations.

Two years ago I was asked to join GETT's Board of Trustees. We assist eye care professionals and others in their attempts to make Gloucestershire's eye care amongst the best in the country, and in the last twelve months alone we have paid out £326,255.00 for some top of the range pieces of medical equipment and training instruments. We have also committed £25,500.00 towards the waiting room facilities in the new eye clinic at Cheltenham General Hospital. Our financial support will provide significant benefits to patients, and we look forward to seeing the new clinic in operation in just a few weeks' time.

Looking forward we need to continue supporting innovations in eye care, and to give the ophthalmic patients in our communities the best possible standards of eye care as our NHS services evolve. With the ever increasing demand on healthcare finances there has never been a more important time for GETT to provide support and assistance. We have some wonderful fundraising supporters, including the incredible Andria Smith whose single-handed efforts since 2012 have raised over £16.5K for our cause. We are most grateful for her dedication and wonderful support for our charity. Other GETT supporters offer personal donations; some offer a bequest in their will and we are most grateful that they took the opportunity to arrange for this at the appropriate time. But we must look to increase our fundraising capabilities further and I would ask everyone to consider making a donation each year, or each month (perhaps by standing order), or to consider leaving a bequest.

Sight is possibly our most precious sense and I am delighted to serve as the chairman of this worthy charity. Thank you for supporting us and our aims.

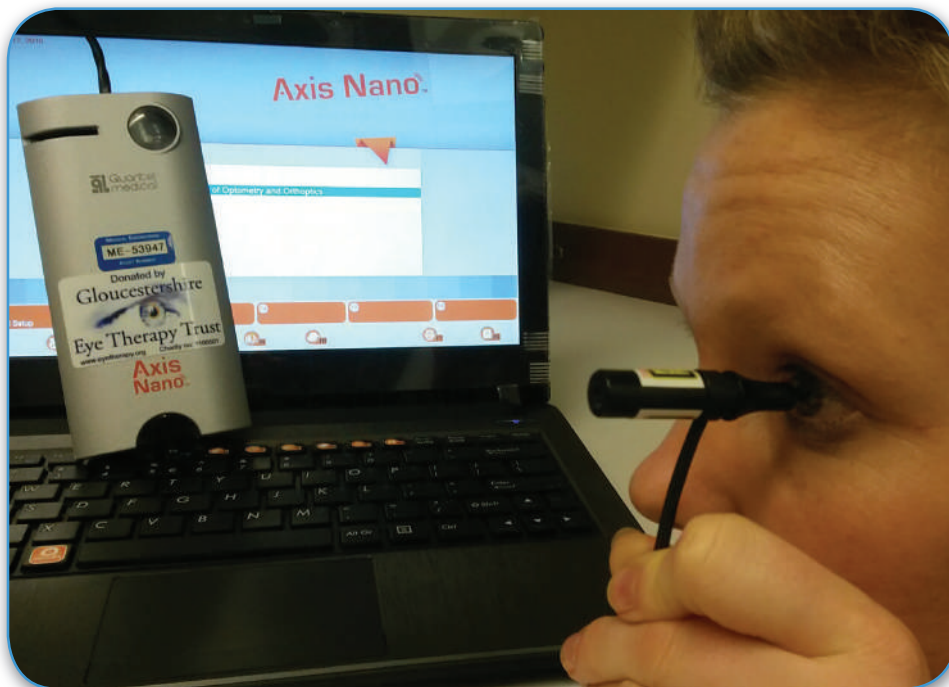


Equipment Purchases / Fundraising

Purchase of Ultrasound Biometer – November 2015

Thanks to the generosity of GETT the Department of Optometry and Orthoptics is now using the Axis Nano high precision Biometer. This piece of equipment is indispensable in the pre-operative assessment of certain patients prior to cataract surgery. This top of the range equipment uses ultrasound to measure the axial length of the eye and help the surgeon decide on the best lens implant. It is the only way of taking a measurement in many cases where there is an advanced cataract or additional complications.

It is small and portable and can easily be taken to the cataract assessment unit or if necessary into the operating theatre. The device is linked to a computer to enable high quality images to be recorded and printed. It will be especially useful in the assessment of particularly vulnerable patients such as those



with severe mobility issues, learning difficulties or dementia. This invaluable piece of equipment will be of benefit to staff and patients alike for many years to come.

State-of-the-art Spectralis Eye imaging Equipment Purchased for Gloucestershire Patients

Patients across the county will soon benefit from more accurate diagnosis and improved treatment for eye conditions and diseases thanks to a generous donation from the Gloucestershire Eye Therapy Trust. The £200k grant enabled our Ophthalmology Department to purchase a new Spectralis OCT angiography device as well as a new combined SLT/ YAG laser.

The SLT/YAG laser is in the purchasing process at present. It will allow treatment to early glaucoma patients without any side-effects or drops and will provide one machine, located at Gloucestershire Royal Hospital, that can treat more than one type of patient. This will provide a more efficient service for glaucoma, iridotomy and capsulotomy patients across the county.

The Spectralis OCT angiography device has already been purchased and is in situ in Cheltenham General Hospital, and will become fully functional in the next few months. It will enhance the diagnosis and management of many eye conditions. The scanner gives more high resolution images of all the layers of the retina and additional details of the vitreous (jelly like compartment in the eye) and choroid (deeper vessels under the retina). The Spectralis tracks the eyes and performs repeat images in the same spot - comparing these images the software can detect moving particles such as blood cells allowing visualization of blood vessels at different depths in the retina. These images can be obtained without the need for an injection of dye into their veins and is quick and painless allowing repeated tests to check

for changes and the ability to get pictures on children and patients with allergy to contrast dyes. This machine is quicker than standard OCT machines and takes wider field images, reducing the time in the Outpatient clinic for each patient and producing more detailed images which allow better diagnosis, more accurate monitoring and better treatment decisions.

Consultant Ophthalmologist Quresh Mohamed said:

Thanks to the generous contribution from Gloucestershire Eye Therapy Trust patients with eye problems in Gloucestershire will have access to one of the most advanced imaging machines in the world which allows pictures to be taken of the blood vessels in the back of the eye without dye.

We will be one of the first NHS hospitals in the UK to have access to the SPECTRALIS HRA FA/ ICG + OCT Multi Colour incl. HRA +OCT device. We expect that approximately 500 patients a month will benefit from more accurate diagnosis and improved treatment as a result of this machine being available to our clinicians.
